

Guelph Soccer Accident and Incident Guidelines

Guelph Soccer recommends that the following procedure is used when dealing with an accident or incident.

- 1. Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation. Is there danger of further injuries?
- 2. Listen to what the injured person is saying.
- 3. Alert the first aider who should take appropriate action for minor injuries or determine if emergency services needs to be called.
- 4. In the event of a serious injury or one requiring specialist treatment, call or appoint someone to call the emergency services (in accordance with the Emergency Action Plan).
- 5. Appoint someone to deal with the rest of the group and ensure that they are adequately supervised.
- 6. Do not move someone with major injuries. Wait for the emergency services personnel.
- 7. Contact the injured person's parent/guardian.
- 8. If the player does not return to play (for the remainder of the game or practice, or for the next game or practice) and/or emergency services are contacted:
 - a. Complete the Accident/Incident Report Form.
 - b. Submit the copy of the Form to the Executive Director/General Manager at Guelph Soccer.
 - c. The Executive Director/General Manager will refer the Accident Report Form to the Board at its next meeting for review. The Board may provide recommendations to the Executive Director/General Manager to try to prevent such accidents/injuries from occurrence in the future.
